"EXPLORING SACRED SCRIPTURES" COLLOQUIUM REACHES ITS 14TH SESSION

During the current semester, the Department organized two colloquium sessions. The first took place on September 25, featuring presenters who shared insights from their research projects. Zandritiana Lovanomena (PhD candidate) presented "An Appraisal of Metarepresentational Negation in John's Gospel," while Dindo Paglinawan (PhD candidate) discussed "Beyond Mysticism: The Ontological Reality of 'You in Me and I in You' in John 14:20." Dr. Hector Martin, who also presided over the event, lectured on "Connecting Propositions."

The 14th colloquium session took place on October 16. This session was distinctive in that, for the first time, two MA-R students presented portions of their research term papers. Daniel Tulalessy explored "Virgin or Young Woman? An Exegetical Study of עלמה in Isaiah 7:14 within its Context," while Mordecai Dwomoh examined "The Meaning and Role of 2

(Light) in Isaiah 60:1-5." Another first for this session was our guest presenter: Anigiselle Regis Alvarez, a PhD student from the Inter-American Theological Seminary in Puerto Rico, who shared her paper "Witnesses and Their Testimonies: The Ninth Commandment Revisited in Deut 19:15-21." We deeply appreciate her participation.

Dr. Teófilo Correa organized this event. Notably, all academic events are supported by BiSSA and, in a special manner, by the VP for Academic Affairs, Francis Doroy.

RAW SESSION ON EFFECTIVE THESIS AND DISSERTATION WRITING



Writing a thesis or dissertation is not only the culminating phase of an academic program but also the stage where degree candidates deepen their scholarship by immersing themselves in research and producing a final report (a thesis/dissertation). Throughout the year, we offer several Research and Academic Writing (RAW) sessions, but once annually we provide a special session open to all seminary students. This year's session took place on October 29 and was entitled "Fundamentals of Effective Thesis and Dissertation Writing." The presenters were all faculty members from the Biblical Studies Department:

- Dr. Martin: "Building a Strong Literature Review"
- Dr. Bergland: "Aligning Methodology with Research Purposes"
- Dr. Nunes: "Formulating the Research Problem and Questions"
- Dr. Correa: "Identifying the Research Gap"

The presentations were followed by a Q&A session. We hope these presentations better equip students who are currently writing their topic requests or thesis/dissertation proposals.
